


















WAGONMASTER MESSAGE, CAMP PETALUMA

Camp Petaluma is really coming together. As of this writing we are full with all of this sites we were given reserved! KOA Petaluma has some campground policies that we must be aware of. Here are a few things you should know. **All attendees must check in at the camp office prior to entering the rv park. At that time you will be issued a parking pass, gate/bathroom code and wristband. Wristbands should be on your person at all times. It is not necessary to wear them, just keep them in a pocket.

- ** Each reservation is for a max occupancy of 4 people and 2 vehicles. If you have more, KOA will charge you extra. If your party is arriving at different times, let KOA office know and they will hold back the wristbands for the remainder of your party, which can be picked up when they arrive.
- ** As usual you will need to keep a deposit on your site from year to year. If there is not deposit on a site, at the end of the meet, it will be considered open and will be assigned to someone on the site wait list. This is your responsibility! I will not be making calls or e-mailing to remind you to do this. If your site is re-assigned don't come crying to me. I don't mean to sound harsh on this topic, but we are all adults here and must take responsibility for our sites.
- **Checkout time is 11am. If you think you will need more time, please let the KOA office know and they may be able to accommodate you. If you don't notify the office and stay passed noon you will be charged for one more day. **We must be considerate of our non member campers. There are about 60 sites that will be used by civilian/tourists campers. Please DO Not Fire Gas Guns! We don't want them to think we are starting WWIII, nor do we want to anger KOA management.
- **Hauling trailers will be parked, on site in a locked yard.
- **There will be limited day visitors parking. Day visitors will be charged \$8.00 per person/day. As of this writing, I believe arrangements are being made for more day visitor parking.

This meet presents an opportunity for our members to make new friends. Your camp neighbors probably have changed. Please take a look at the interactive map on our web site to get to know your neighbors. Maybe, one night you can plan a potluck or progressive dinner with them. 


