

Again wanting to get ahead of the Newsletter deadline; unfortunately this report won't be as long or as interesting as last months. But I'm starting today (9/19/2020). Don't know if you MV collectors know that today is "drive your Porsche Day". Although Ferdinand Porsche was born on Sept 3rd 1875, someone decided that the 19th of September should be the day to celebrate his 356 design.

A little known fact is that Porsche designed the first hybrid automobile in 1900. Check my facts here. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Lohner-Porsche. He also was instrumental in the design of the Volkswagen Beetle; along with the "Auto Union Racing Car" and the Mercedes-Benz SS/SSK. All of these activities took place prior to WW II. During the war he did join the Nazi Party and was instrumental in the development of several tanks, most notable the "Elefant", where a number of them took part in the "Battle of Kurst".

So where am I going with this story. After the war Ferdinand started making his 356 models in 1948 (made a total of 49 handmade) that year. Unfortunately he died in 1951 and never got to see how popular his 356 design model became, but the Porsche name and new model cars are still made today.

Since it is (was) "drive your Porsche Day" a few friends that own 356 Porsches did just that. Like last months "convoy" we got together here at my place (there were three of us); two in Champagne Yellow and one in a nice Blue (not sure they came in that color in 1965).



Now one last thing that us 356 owners say; "We know they made Porsches after 1965 – but who cares".

The American Armory Museum's 2020 Military Vehicle Demonstration Weekend by Chris Hughes

On the weekend of October 10/11, 2020, the American Armory Museum(AAM) in Fairfield held their annual "Military Vehicle Demonstration Weekend". The weekend long event showcased the AAM's various military vehicles and museum with both static displays and running vehicles. The event also included an auto show, swap meet, and a car crush.

This was the fourth time the AAM has held an open house weekend and the second time that they included the vehicle demonstrations. Based on attendance of both display vehicles and visitors, it was the best one so far. The AAM barbeque booth actually ran out of food midway through the first day as demand was much greater than anticipated. The auto show had over 25 vehicles in attendance with sports and muscle cars being the most numerous type seen. Approximately 10 booths were set up for the swap meet portion of the show. Scale model kits, toys, and military surplus equipment were the dominant items seen for sale.

Members of the military vehicle community were also invited to display their vehicles at the event and a good number of them



showed up, including some members of the MVCC. Several jeeps, trucks, and a half-track joined the AAM's vehicle display for the two-day event. Combined with the AAM's vehicles, there were more than 40 jeep, trucks, and armored vehicles being shown. Several of the AAM's vehicles were used to give rides to paying guests on the vehicle track.

The highlight of the show was the car crushing. Each day of the event at 1pm, the AAM's Chieftain main battle tank crushed two cars that were out in the middle of the vehicle track. Taking part in the destruction with the Chieftain was an Abbot 105mm self-propelled howitzer. The sight of metal being crushed and the sound of glass shattering brought many cheers and applause from the audience.

The American Armory Museum holds their open house/vehicle demonstration every October. They're hoping to host an event later this Spring and would like to invite members of the MVCC to come out with vehicles to camp out and run them on the track. If any club members are interested in such an event or have some ideas about one, please contact the AAM. 

Since everyone seems to be enjoying my jeep retrieval articles, here's another interesting story with photos:

Back in February, 2011, I spotted a jeep on eBay that looked interesting. It was a faded red '43 GPW in fair condition, with a lot of original parts still attached. Bubba had also been messing with it sometime in the past with a few modifications, but nothing that couldn't easily be corrected. According to the listing, it was located in Southern California near Palm Springs. When the listing suddenly ended, I contacted the seller and learned that the jeep was still for sale but had been pulled off eBay because of some uncertainty concerning the vehicle description. (He had described it as having a machine gun mount and was worried that this might cause a problem with "the authorities".) After talking with the seller and thinking it over a bit, I made an offer of \$1,850 and it was accepted. I made arrangements to meet the seller and a friend of his at a hotel in the L.A. area, and then go see the jeep. I asked my wife, Nancy, if she wanted to go see Palm Springs. She was excited to go, so off we went in the trusty F150 with the car trailer to buy the jeep.

When we got to the hotel, things sounded a little suspicious when I found out he was selling it for someone else. The seller's friend would be taking us to the jeep, located close to where he lived. The seller wanted a "deposit" of \$600, with the balance to be paid to the owner when we picked up the jeep. About this time, I figured out the seller was actually a broker, not the owner, and the deposit was his commission. He gets paid up front with very little risk, then steps aside. Not great... But we'd come this far, so we decided to follow through and trust that there really was a jeep at the end of the rainbow.

We set off the next morning, heading southeast toward Palm Springs. It turned out the jeep was actually closer to Palo Verde, a little farming community out in the desert near the California/Arizona border, about two hours southeast of Palm Springs! As we passed by Palm Springs I said, "Look, there's Palm Springs!" about a mile south of the freeway. So much for truth in advertising. I'm still living that one down...

Along the way, we would be passing by the General Patton Memorial Museum at Chiriaco Summit, so we stopped in



for a visit. It's a great little tank museum with several examples of WWII tanks on display. Since we were at the Patton Museum, our guide wondered if we'd like to take a "short cut" through Patton's training grounds, just south of the museum. "Sure, why not?", we said. Little did we know it was three hours through the desert on dirt roads. About an hour into the desert, the thought crossed our minds that if this guy wanted to knock us off and take our money, nobody would ever know. It was actually a very interesting trek, with tank track ruts still visible along the roads and bunker emplacements still visible on the bluffs.

We finally arrived at the homestead where the jeep was parked, in a small compound on the edge of the Chocolate Mountain Bombing Range (USN). The owners were an eccentric couple that made their living selling scrap metal gathered by making clandestine trips into the bombing range to collect it. We were told the jeep actually belonged to a recently deceased lady whose husband had died a few years previously. The widow willed the jeep and the entire contents of her trailer and out buildings to the scrapper couple. The scrapper husband wanted to scrap the jeep, but the wife wanted to see if it someone would buy it first, which is probably why they didn't bat an eye when they got their \$1,250 for it. So I saved another one from the scrappers!

After paying for the jeep, we were told we could have anything we wanted from the widow's place since they were going to bulldoze it all soon. So of course we made the three mile trip to the widow's property and picked through all kinds of things in the shop and garage, picking up three or four gas cans, a carburetor, a starter, and other MV related items. Sadly, the original GPW engine was not there (the jeep had a Willys Industrial engine installed and was not running). As we were getting ready to head back to the jeep, Nancy asked me if I had seen the bomb out by the entrance gate. "Bomb? What bomb?", I said. It turned out to be a WWII 100 lb. bomb casing with the fuse and internal explosive charge removed, standing up-



right on its fins as an ornament by the gate. Yes, these people were scrappers too... We tossed the bomb in the back of the truck with the rest of the spare parts.

After loading the jeep on the trailer, we prepared to head for home. The guide said, "Oh, just take this road south for a few miles, make a left turn at the water pipe, go straight for a couple of miles and you'll get to the highway. Yea, right... He refused to guide us out of the middle of the desert and we didn't have GPS or a map. We were not pleased. It was starting to get dark by this time, but we made it out to the highway. The spare tire on the trailer fell off somewhere along the washboard road, but I wasn't about to go back and look for it.

Our route took us within sight of Mexico, through Galmis and Brawley south of the Salton Sea. After dark, we were passing by an OHV recreation area with dune buggies running around jumping sand dunes. A truck pulled in behind me and started tailgating, so I naturally sped up to around 70 MPH, towing a trailer with an old jeep on it and a truck bed full of parts. Suddenly, red lights came on behind me. The tailgater was a cop! I pulled over and handed over my license and registration. The cop asked where I was from and where I was going. I told him we had just picked up this jeep from some scrappers out in the desert and were trying to get home. He walked around and checked out the jeep and the stuff in the truck bed, then came back and said we should slow down and not push the speed limit, handed back my license and registration and wished us a safe trip – no speeding ticket and never even mentioned the bomb sitting in the truck bed...

Five years later, I had restored the '43 GPW to be my "trail jeep", keeping the larger M38 radiator and T-90 transmission, along with adding 7.00-16 NDTs for better clearance and off road traction, and replacing the dead Willys Industrial engine with a low time '43 MB engine removed from a generator. It's been on several off road trips and has been a great jeep. ... Dave...

Theme name for this years virtual event is called: "Honor Their Sacrifice"






