I worked the HEMTT crane quite a bit this month in an effort to not only find the leaking cylinder but to see if exercising it would reduce the leaking. I identified the leak which is coming from one of the 2 lift cylinders. Unfortunately, exercising the crane didn't reduce the leaking.

I'm working on getting the proper repair kit but I'm not sure I'll have it done by Plymouth. I'm still bringing the HEMTT to Plymouth; leaky cylinder and all. I should be able to prop up the mast in a way that will allow me to remove that cylinder without too much trouble. The fun part will be lifting it out. I may need to use my tractor front bucket and some lifting straps.



<u>Greetings from the North!</u> We are getting very close to getting back to Plymouth for the MVCC Spring Meet. Are you ready? I'm still figuring out what to bring, including stuff to sell. In the meantime, I'm having fun driving and working on various military jeeps and trucks.

We had a successful outing to Ryan and David Shelley's cabin in Somerset, with a trail ride up to the snow on February 20<sup>th</sup>. Known as the annual "Vintage 4x4 Run", most of the participants bring civilian 4x4's, but there are always a few military vehicles in attendance. It was a MUD FEST this year – especially the road into the cabin. Mud, Mud and more Mud – the gooey, sticky kind that's hard to wash off! For something different this year, I trailered the Weasel out to the access road a couple days before the main run and drove it up to the cabin. Several people got their first ride in a Weasel up there. It performed amazingly well in the mud around the cabin and up and down the half-mile access road. It pretty much ignored the mud except for a lack of effective steering (worn out track brakes), making it hard to negotiate the sharp switchbacks up to the cabin. It also gained a couple hundred pounds of mud on the suspension and tracks, but it was great fun to drive it around and show it off. My V8-powered CJ2A performed well on the trail ride, and also brought home a ton of mud. Photos attached (before most of the mud...).

On another subject: I receive the monthly newsletter from the South Pacific WWII Museum, located in Vanuatu, previously known as the New Hebrides Islands in the South Pacific near Australia. Vanuatu was the site of the largest rear-area Allied base in the Pacific during WWII, functioning as a supply base as well as a repair station for vehicles, ships and aircraft, and had a large hospital and rest-and-recovery (R&R) area for injured military personnel. Nancy and I visited Vanuatu on a great vacation in 2009 and plan to return in 2022. Contact us if you're interested in joining us. The Museum is under development and welcomes any WWII related items pertaining to the US presence there during the war.

Anyway, an article in a recent Museum newsletter included photos from the 10<sup>th</sup> CASU (Carrier Aircraft Service Unit 10) at the Fighter #1 Airstrip at Turtle Bay on Espiritu Santos, New Hebrides, in 1944. A GTBS Bomb Service Truck is visible in the background of a picture of the CASU Ordinance Crew posed around a jeep. The Museum also sent me another photo of a Kiwi-operated GTBS. New Zealand operated a PBY Catalina squadron on Santo during the war and carried bombs on their aircraft, so they had need for bomb service trucks. I thought both photos were interesting, documenting the use of the Ford GTBS (and what appears to be a '42 Ford GPW) in the Pacific during WWII. Photos attached.





### The tale of a "quick and easy" restoration.

We've all been there and yet I keep falling for the same trap, but it's an addiction! So here I am flipping through my hot off press May 2020 MVCC Newsletter and against my better judgment, I go straight to the classifieds section. That's when I spotted my next project. It was none other than a 1943 Case SI Aircraft Carrier tractor being sold by Dave Ball. What could be better than a mash-up between our hobby and my occupation of selling Case IH agriculture tractors? Well, let's just say I was intrigued. After speaking with Dave and learning some of it's history, I decided to head to his place that weekend and grow my collection. This tractor was surplused out of Port Hueneme and ended up in Yuma, AZ. Dave bought it from a collector back in 2008 and started his own research and collecting parts in anticipation of restoring it.

Upon inspection, I believe I made the comment "this'll be easy and only take a month or two" at which point dad (Mark Bombini) gave me the look as he knew that couldn't be further from the truth. Hey, isn't that how all projects start?

Once we got it home, the teardown and documentation began along with tons of research. This tractor is the same basic machine as Case SI airborne tractors with the following differences: smaller tires, down turned exhaust with a muffler, a horn, rear bumper/frame, and an automatic coupler (hitch). While there was a lot of good going on with the tractor, there was also some hidden damage from years of hard use. It took an extremely hard hit up front at some point that bent a lot of sheet metal and broke some castings. Luckily, any parts I needed were either the same as the civilian models or I was able to acquire original blueprints from Case IH. The worst part of the whole project was the cleaning. The whole tractor was covered in a petrified tar like substance formed from years of leaking oil and dirt. Dad had recently retired in March 2020 so I was bound and determined to make sure he had plenty of stuff to keep him busy. What a thoughtful son! Well, I accomplished that when he volunteered to spend countless hours chipping and wire wheeling away all the grunge from the engine and transmission housing. He looked like he survived a major battle with the blood dripping from his arms every time a wire would break off the wire wheel and spear him.

The engine came out and was filled with years of sludge, so the head came off to determine the extent of the wear. Luckily the bottom end was in good condition, but the head needed to go in to be surfaced, get the intake valves replaced, and new valve guides. Once all the cleaning was done, it was go time. Surely it can't take that long to paint and reassemble this simple little tractor, right? Sure it can! The painting was easy but the further I delved into this project, the more details I'd find. Along the way, some parts were made with lots of research to determine what's correct for this model and what's been modified.


We're closing in on the home stretch now with the tractor about 90 percent done but as of this writing, I'm still waiting on my starter and generator/regulator combo to come back from professional restoration (don't ask how much that's going to cost!!) as well as the hood from media blasting so we can straighten and repair it before paint. I was able to uncover some original markings that will be repainted back onto it. I've also added tools to my collection such as a new to me sheet metal shear and finger brake along with a new spot welder allowing me to reproduce parts correctly.

I'm hoping to have all the missing pieces here soon as the goal is to showcase the trac-

tor at Plymouth. After this one is completed, I need to finish a 1942 Bantam T3 and 1940 Ben Hur trailer before diving into the M29C Weasel I acquired out of Alaska. That one is a story still in the making...
