





Celebrating the 80th Anniversary of Eagle Field

Eagle Field AAF base was opened in 1942 specifically to train pilots for World War II. From April 1942 to the winter of 1944 about five thousand pilots were trained in Ryan PT-22 and Boeing Stearman PT-17 aircraft. Purchased in 1980 by Joe Davis, Eagle Field is a link back to a very important and pivotal time in America's history. Having been saved, hopefully in the years to come it will be fully restored. We need your support.

This, our 33rd Warbird Fly-In and Dinner Dance promises to be a very entertaining historical event. Past aircraft have included PT-17 and PT-22 trainers, B-25 and PV-2 bombers, P-40, P-51, Corsair, Bearcat and Wildcat fighters, an ME-108, L-Birds and even a veteran C-53 transport that dropped paratroopers on D-Day.

In the past, military vehicles have included Jeeps, Half-Tracks, Weasels, Command Cars, Tanks, Cleatracks, APCs, Cargo Trucks, Weapons Carriers, Staff Cars and Artillery/Anti-Aircraft pieces.

Many will dress in World War II period attire. Espana's of Los Banos will cater our Saturday night dinner and you will sit at a beautifully decorated table. Knight Sounds, a classy 1940's big band from Modesto, will provide live big band music. There is always an exciting swing dance contest. Our veterans will be given special recognition.

In anticipation of the upcoming Barn Find / Unrestored Showcase, here's the story of one of my jeep projects, a 1945 GPW I picked up near Dayton, Nevada a few years ago. This jeep, Ford GPW 275928, is one of the last GPWs assembled, most likely around July 16, 1945 (data plates are missing). GPW production ended with serial number 277898 in July (or maybe August), 1945. My '45 GPW is missing it's engine, but the rest of the running gear is still there. It came with an early Slat Grill hood (which got sold at one of the Tower Park swap meets) and pair of original "F"-marked seats. Brackets and mounting holes on the frame indicate it was equipped with "deep mudder" exhaust, with the muffler mounted under the rear floor. The tub shows evidence that it may have been a "Follow-Me" jeep (yellow paint under the existing mostly-white paint job and holes in the rear inner fender wells that might be there to carry a follow-me sign). It might have been used to guide aircraft at one of the local stateside airbases during or after WWII. Perhaps it served at Stead Airfield north of Reno or Fallon Naval Air Station – who knows! As with most jeep projects, it's difficult to determine exactly where they served, but I think most didn't stray far from where they served when they were surplussed. Plans for restoration have been on the back burner for a while, but once I finish the '45 MB, the





GPW is next in line. Maybe I will find a suitable engine at Plymouth!




Snow in Lake Tahoe

Hello from Lake Tahoe. Some of you know that I have one of the 1/2 ton command cars at the Camp Plymouth Dodge Boys camp, but when it's all tucked away for the winter, it's my 1951 M37 that gets me around when the snow gets deep. I learned about 30 years ago to have the truck ready for winter. Fueled up, oil changed, hubs locked, chains on. Since the M37 lives outside, it is a lot easier to chain up when it's dry, before the storms. My wife says I scare off the storms by being ready, but this year I proved her wrong. The late December series of storms brought 100" of heavy, wet Sierra Cement here, at 6300' lake level. This brought trees down around the Basin, power went off, and plows were few and far between. This caught a lot of Tahoe newcomers off guard, as the average Prius or Tesla does quite poorly in deep snow. In fact there are still some autolumps scattered around the neighborhood that will be either rediscovered in spring, or will be shot into the woods by the big rotary blower when it comes around to widen the street back to 2 lanes. So, wood stove and generator running, driveway plowed, and no tracks in the street, I fire up the M37 to head into town to retrieve my son from his place for Christmas. As soon as I pulled into the street, I knew that I made the right choice of vehicles today, I am pretty sure my 3/4 ton 4x4 pickup would be stuck immediately. The M37 was working hard, and low range was needed, but I was moving, and I slowly made my way the 1/4 mile to Pioneer Trail, a main route. Along the way I had driven into a hole made by a tracked skid steer that does driveway snow removal. Snow came over the hood, and that was fun, because I couldn't see anything, but wanted to keep moving. I wrestled open the ventilating windshield and cleared the snow off the hood enough to see. On the 2 mile trip into town, I dodged buried and stuck cars, trucks, tourists walking in the middle of the road, snowmobiles, and intersections with no power. (you go, no-you go). With the deep pack on the streets, the chains made almost no noise, and at one point I even

stopped to make sure they were still there. All was good, and on the return into my neighborhood, I took a different route to my house because there were now vehicles stuck crossways in my track, those that had tried to follow. This route was deeper, and uphill for the last 50 yards, which required several back ups once forward progress stopped. But we made it without winching, always a plus. I have gone out several more times, helped a few neighbors get unstuck, ran a few errands, and all I can say is this 70 year old truck, that I have owned since I was 25, still gets it done when the going gets deep, and has been the most reliable vehicle I have ever owned. And yes, I did get a lot of thumbs up, as well as dumbfounded looks along the way.

This month I kept working on the halftrack project. I received the impact screwdriver bit that I had mentioned in last month's news-

letter. It's a hardy looking bit and fit the armored bolts nice and tight.

For the first test, I tried it on armored bolts that I had broken loose but could not hold on to them without it spinning. This worked great. I held onto the nut with a box wrench and used the impact to spin off the bolt. Piece of cake! The next test was to try to break loose a bolt without breaking the nut loose first. I hit it a couple times with the impact and "SNAP" the bit twisted and broke...CRUD. There goes my \$10.00 bit.

I still think the test was a success since now I know I need to break the nuts loose first then I can spin them off with the bit. I bought another bit and should be back on track in another week. Since my bit broke, I shifted my efforts to getting some of the old welds ground off the halftrack. It takes quite a bit of time and grinding wheel to get down to the armor but I'll get there. You'll notice in this picture you can see where the weld was. It's actually pitted in that area. There isn't much I can do in regards to the scar (no way I'm gonna use bondo on an MV) so I guess that'll just give her some character.

Camp Plymouth is rapidly approaching so be sure to get cracking on your MV PMs so you're ready to roll when the time comes. Remember, I'm the POC for the M151 showcase and I expect a great turnout. M3A4 Rock Island Arsenal Handcart

I said "are you sure?" and we turned around. Sure enough this poor relic was sitting neglected all by itself in the weeds. We found a neighbor who gave me the owner's telephone number and I made a deal. I'm still not sure how my buddy spotted it as it has so much extra stuff welded to it. Apparently it had been used to haul a welder as it had provisions for welding hoses. It even had a bracket bolted on with thirteen 3/8" bolts to the back to hold tail lights.

It was clearly going to be a big project. Step one; remove all of the extra "junk". After an evening of grinding and cutting, progress was getting made. I put the tools away for the evening and went in the house to get ready for bed. Soon after my wife called out that there was a fire in the backyard. My grinding had caught nearby barkdust on fire along with a small wood pile. Well, trying not to panic I grabbed the nearby garden hose and while my wife was turning on the water I was getting into position to fight the fire. Of course the hose was a victim of the fire and had been melted so water wouldn't come out. Now the panic is setting in! Another hose was exchanged for the



useless one and the fire was put out without any more collateral damage.

The next day restoration started again with more careful planning. The plywood bed was removed and the steel body slats underneath it were in pretty good shape. The missing tow rings were reproduced and welded in place. Missing parts were ordered from Ed Snyder. Tires and tubes taken out of my stash of parts. Lots of unofficial holes welded shut. It was really taking shape.





Unfortunately the data plate had long been removed. But only Rock Island Arsenal made carts without any of the holes around the sides for the various brackets to get bolted on.
