


There is talk that the showcases might be moved to Saturday! USO dinner & dance on Saturday as well, so I hear. Stay tuned.



Russian River Jeep Run


On July 8, six intrepid troopers in five WW2 jeeps tackled dirt and pavement in the west Russian River area: Dave "Seabee" Aro, Matt "The Local" Parry, Keith "Doc" Palmer, Ernie "Stretch" Ongaro, Gary "What me worry" Hurwitz, and the author. This is great jeep driving country!

We drove down 116 to the mouth of the Russian River to Jenner for deli sandwiches. A cold wind was coming off the ocean. Jeeps owned by, starting with left front clockwise: author, Keith, Matt, Dave, Ernie. Our loop went northwest on State Route 1, then branched more north on the scenic Myer's Grade Road. It didn't take long to get warmer as we went up and inland. At Fort Ross Road we went southeast down the long, twisty road to the ex-lumber and vacation town of Cazadero.




The Cazadero History Learning Center shown above opened in June 2022. It looks like a mini train station, open the second Saturday of every month, 11 am to 4 pm. This is a partnership between the Russian River Historical Society and the Cazadero Community Services District. It is managed by RRHS President Jane Barry, wife of Willys America owner and MVCC member Paul Barry. Willys America, in the distance in the picture on the right, is a well-known Jeep truck and Jeepster parts vendor, restoration shop, and museum. No relation to the Berry's that own the sawmill and lumber yard that moved to the foot of Austin Creek.



Tiny Cazadero is about six miles north of the river via Austin Creek Road or Cazadero Highway. The latter was built on the former right of way for a branch of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad. It used to be well-known for Berry's Sawmill, supplying redwood and oak since 1941 to farmers, ranchers, and big beams for the nearby quicksilver mine which provided mercury to make mercury fulminate for gun cartridge primers during WW2. Loren Berry joined the army and built sawmills for them worldwide. Trains hauled wood south to ferries in Sausalito, and vacationers north in the summer to the resorts along Austin Creek. All gone now. My brother in law's postcard collection of Austin Creek resorts is on display in the museum to the left.

Greetings from the North. I thought you all might like to hear the story of my M29C Weasel. I always say every MV has a story, so here's the story of a genuine WWII tracked military vehicle:

Back in early 2009, a friend of mine told me about a '45 Weasel he'd seen for sale. It was listed on Craigslist and sounded interesting, so I went to see it. It was parked at a residence near the entrance to Donner Ski Ranch, at the summit on Highway 50. Its recently deceased owner had operated it for several years and used it for winter transportation when snow closed the highway. He took it to get groceries and supplies for his family and friends up on the mountain. When he died, his wife gave it to one of the neighbors. The neighbor in turn put it up for sale.

We heard from the wife that there were more parts to go with it, from a parted-out Weasel down in Isleton, so we made the trip to get them too. The engine from the Isleton parts went into Cary Simpson's weasel.

It was painted orange and had a Korean War vintage hardtop on it, with the removable side panels replaced with clear plexiglass. It also had dual headlights (original WWII had a single headlight), which is another indication that it saw service during the Korean War. It had the original Studebaker 170 c.i. flathead 6-cyl engine but was not currently running. It supposedly had recently been operated, so it was a "ran-when-parked" situation. It had minimal rust, good windshield, and good, original tracks. The original fuel tank had been replaced with an aluminum beer keg. The driver's seat was some kind of small civilian car bucket seat. The original engine cover had been replaced with a flat plywood shelf. He wanted \$3,500 but settled for \$3,000 cash (it's worth a lot more now). We brought a trailer, just in case, so we loaded it up and took it home.

It turned out to have a "kill" switch wired into the ignition, so once I found that and switched it to the "run" position it started right up. One problem though, it had a stuck clutch. Hmm... must have been parked longer than he said. With a little work (the original T-84 transmission is easy to remove) a new clutch was installed, and we were off on our first test drive. Weasels are a whole lot of fun to drive and surprisingly maneuverable for a tracked vehicle.

Over the years I have added an engine cover fabricated to original specs, a replica driver's seat back (from George Smith, our club Weasel Guru), an original style fuel tank and filler neck, replica side skirts, and a hinged access door where there used to be an opening cut into the side of the hull. I've also replaced several bogie wheels when the rubber rim came off. Early on, I painted it Marine Corps green and added the actual hull serial number as a USMC vehicle number. I'm in the process of building a set of tracks using bolt-on conveyor belt bands in place of the original deteriorating bands.

The Weasel gets periodic use at MV and Veterans events, and has demonstrated its excellent driving capabilities in mud, snow, swamp, gravel, pavement, and deep water. It is absolutely unstoppable, easily getting through terrain that would bury a wheeled vehicle. It has too many holes in the hull (yes, rust holes) to try to float it, but it is theoretically amphibious (able to float). Look for it at one of the upcoming meets!

Hello MV'ers.

Hope you're doing well and had a great 4th of July! We missed all the fun since we took off with Henry to visit Bestemor in Norway. Before heading out Henry and I attended the Power Wagon Rally at Hollister Hills SVRA. It was a great event and I always enjoy seeing all the Dodges gathered together and getting dirty. Hopefully some of you were able to get out and enjoy the 4th of July events in the East Bay. If so, send me some photos & captions for the next newsletter.

I FINALLY have the M37 back on the road. I was tired of the truck sitting and the "new" engine will not get done until after school starts up so I decided to see what I could do with the engine in the truck and parts on hand. I figured I'd try an experiment. The engine needed a valve job, cylinder head and radiator. Now that the old Sioux equipment was sorted out the valve job wasn't an issue. The cylinder head was the experimental part. I had a '59 high compression head on the shelf that had been heavily milled and had mismatched chambers ranging from 68-76cc's (72.8cc average). For reference a stock M37 head is ~101cc's. I wasn't happy with the large size range on the chambers, but was curious to see how the engine would run with more compression when compared to the cracked 80cc head being removed. Visions of rebuilding a radiator were put on hold when the local shop said they weren't interested in touching one, so I'd get the chance to "test" the unit from the burnt M37 I picked up. After a bit of work all the pieces magically came together and guess what, the darn thing runs well and tolerates the higher compression without issue. I haven't had the chance to put it on the dyno yet, but it pulls the big hill near my home better than ever and the truck is roadworthy again. This has me asking why I didn't do this sooner. The perfect is the enemy of the good...



A Response to Editor Article in the July Issue by John Neuenburg

In July Johnny brought up what some think is "the elephant in the room" regarding our Spring and Fall meets: how they have become weekday oriented, not weekend. This indeed works against the future of our club and the organized hobby because the young people we need to correct our aging demographic mostly have weekday jobs. If married, often both work. Same goes for those in their 40s and 50s. The only way many of these people can attend during the week is to schedule vacation days. Those new to our hobby might not be able to justify devoting two or three vacation days out of the 5-10 they receive per year. If they have children under 18 there is pressure to do a "family vacation" that can consume five days. Having kids in school makes attending on a school day more challenging. Should one spouse stay home with the kids and drive separately Friday afternoon or Saturday morning to join the other? What is the incentive on Saturday to attract them? The more "hooked" people get on MVs, and especially if the spouse also likes the events, the more likely they are to take vacation days. But how do we get them "hooked" on our events in the meantime?


I want to provide some historical context and offer some suggestions. Marilynn and my first Spring meet was the Patterson Rally 1986. I have not missed one since and for her, I think only one. I have seen all the changes and been actively involved in some as a VP a couple of times, and later as the major event Activities Coordinator plus creating much of the advertising. In the 1980s and into the '90s the swap meets were advertised Thursday-Saturday and significant activities were advertised on Saturdays until 1993. For most, Sunday was the go-home day. On Friday nights there were military movies. Saturday morning the Southern California Chapter did a pancake breakfast. A member meeting was on Saturday and often another daytime activity. On Saturday night there was a dinner and "USO Dance" in the rec building. This basic schedule lasted until the 1993, the third Spring meet at Big Bear Park in Waterford. That year, the party/dance was moved to Friday and it has been that way ever since. The reason was to accommodate those who wanted to pull out on Saturday. By this time the Spring meet had grown to be the big West Coast MV meet, and quite a few attendees had long drives home. Some probably had a lot of parts to put away too. Probably some who arrived early ran out of money or parts to sell by then! Did we see more departures on Saturday after moving the main social event to Friday evening? As I remember, yes. If we had left the dinner/dance on Saturday, likely more would have stayed that night. What started that year was a shift away from a serious Saturday schedule.

Complicating this situation is the cost per night for all but the tenters and those commuting from home. Moving to Tower Park meant cabins were available. More were installed later. Petaluma KOA offered cabins as does the 49er. These have gotten very expensive, because at these popular campgrounds there is a demand. Those who rent cabins, or a rental trailer plus site fee, or a hotel, have to decide if that Saturday night expense is worth it. Now if we moved either swap meet to a venue with no cabins, people who will not tent or truck camp will book a rental travel trailer or hotel room - not inexpensive but less than a big cabin - commute, or not attend.

Logically, the only solution to this challenge is to go back to doing more on Saturdays: a dinner/party/dance_for all, not just MVCC members, a daytime activity like a MV gymkhana or teeter totter, road run, or appearance by the EMU-309 Huey helicopter, plus a member meeting. Maybe do movies on Friday night, or a lecture or other presentation like MV travel videos? We should keep the MVCC HQ tent open through Saturday afternoon, including at the Fall meet. Make pancake breakfasts on Saturday morning an annual thing. We had 201 MVs counting trailers at Spring 1990 at Patterson, so that schedule worked. Also, don't do any advertising saying the event starts before Wednesday. If we schedule more on Saturday, will those who absolutely won't stay through Saturday not attend at all? I doubt that. They will still show up mid-week.

Having a swap meet-type rally in late June, July, or August is an answer to attract families with kids. We tried that starting in 2002 when we moved the Fall Casa de Fruta social meet from October to June and moved the Woodson Bridge meet from early September to October to have cooler weather. The latter move would probably improve our current Fall meet attendance. One problem is many campgrounds start Fall and Halloween-themed activities October 1 and they get full.

Another suggestion is to not require a four-night minimum stay at the 49er. That works against the challenge Johnny brought up. If they don't require it to give us the discount we get, let people book the nights they want. It will open the event up to people who can't take much time off, and those with a modest hobby budget. Requiring four nights or even three is trying to "push" Tuesday or Wednesday attendance, but only to us retired people and the most hobby oriented. I suggest we "pull" people instead, focusing on what works for them. Broaden our demographics.

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

Past Event Vehicle Counts

By John Neuenburg

When I was doing some research on past events for a letter I wrote to Johnny about his July article asking what we can do to attract more younger participants, I ran across an interesting after action article in the June 1990 newsletter about the Patterson Rally. The writer talked about how the Spring meet had grown in a dozen years. The vehicle count was interesting: 4 tracked, 62 jeeps, 2 motorcycles, 4 bicycles, 4 scooters, 8 Mules, 3 command cars, 2 staff cars, 1 carryall, 2 ambulance, 41 other trucks, 55 trailers, 1 fire truck, 1 search light, 2 pickups, 11 miscellaneous. Total 201 MVs! Since I didn't have anything better to do, I looked at other newsletters for MV counts, normally by our Secretary Pat Thelander. Here are some published MV totals counting trailers:

Editor said less than 400 members in the club 2006 - 164 Rain 1997 - 180 2007 - "Over 200" and she heard it was the biggest 1998 - 168 "Down due to rain" event in U.S. 1999 – 125 Some people probably waited for 1999 2008 - "Almost 200"

We had good growth during the 13 years of the Spring Tower Park meet, the most central location we have used. For a period after 2008 we neglected to publish MV counts consistently. There are a lot of factors that go into the number of vehicles and people who attend. Location very important. The weather forecast too. The SoCal club starting an annual 60-site camping meet in 2018 probably decreased the number from the south who travel north, especially with an MV. For 2023 Camp Plymouth, Johnny reported "over 135 MVs." A low number but we are apparently up on campsites used and especially visitor attendance. That venue checks a lot of our boxes, like capacity for RVs and tents, visitor parking, nice MV driving area, great place to bring a spouse, but it's farther from where our MV concentration is compared to Tower Park and even Big Bear. With fuel costs being high that hurts some who like to drive or tow MVs. But do what you can,

My Liberty Truck By Aidan McMackin

My Liberty be was delivered on 3/24 1919 and is a post-war fulfillment contract. It is one of the few trucks that wasn't exported. It was probably used in the Pacific Northwest at an army base there. Somewhere around Yakima or The Dalles. It was surplus out at an unknown time and was used on a farm. Once the engine failed it was put in a barn and sat there until it was purchased by the previous owner who then sold it to me. There was at least two Liberties on the farm. One was slowly strip down for parts and now exists as just a frame

The Class-B Standardized Military Truck or "Liberty Truck" was a heavyduty truck produced by the United States Army during World War I. It was designed by the Quartermaster Corps with help from the Society of Automotive Engineers in 1917 in an effort to help standardize the immense parts catalogue and multiple types of vehicles then in use by the US military, as well as create a truck which possessed all the best features of heavy truck technology then available. It was the first official standardized motor vehicle adopted and produced by the US Military.



From Wiki-The Liberty truck was designed by the Motor Transport section of the Quartermaster Corps in cooperation with the members of the civil-




ian Society of Automotive Engineers. Prototype design of the 3-5 ton truck began in mid-1917, and the first two running prototypes appeared 69 days after the design was finalized in mid-1917. Both trucks were assembled and driven over 400 miles from their assembly locations to Washington D.C., arriving without any major breakages or halts on October 19, 1917 and presented to Secretary of War Newton D. Baker. Following its approval and subsequent small changes to some design and technical aspects, official production of the First-type truck began in January 1918 with parts being produced by 150 different companies and assembly contracts awarded to 15 companies. The following are numbers produced in total prior to the signing of the Armistice of 11 November 1918.

Of the 9,364 produced prior to the Armistice, several made it to French shores all of the 1st Series variant with electric lights. The first trucks arrived in early October 1918 and steadily flowed into French ports before and after the Armistice. Few made it into frontline service by wars end. Contracts for an additional 43,000 vehicles were canceled in December 1918 and production halted on trucks entirely by 1919. Following the war, many Class-B Liberty trucks were sold-off surplus to the civilian market and other militaries.



Some trucks would see use by foreign armies such as the early Polish Airforce and Army during the Polish-Bolshevik War of 1920-21, as well as with
